

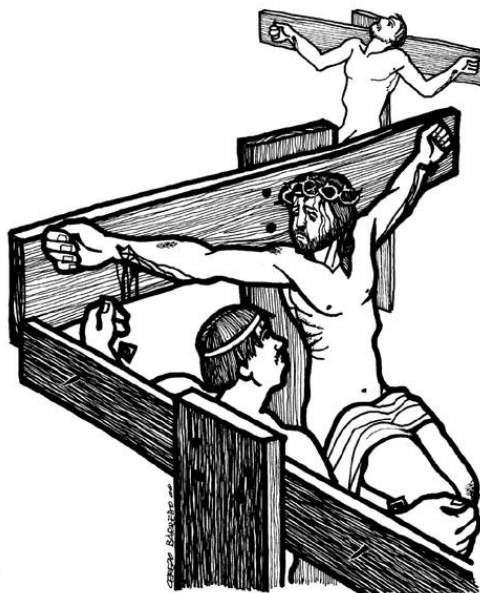

Suspension of Presentation

In September 2004, following Fr Lee Bennett's departure, presentation to the parish of Huddersfield All Saints and St Thomas was suspended. That meant that when a new priest was appointed he was a priest in charge with a licence for a specific number of years. Had presentation not been suspended a priest would have been appointed with *freehold*, enabling him to remain as parish priest until his seventieth birthday.

This is done to allow the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee the opportunity of bringing about a pastoral scheme to unite one or more parishes or benefices. In the case of our own parish no such proposals have been made.

After five years, there has to be a consultation process in order to extend the period of suspension of presentation. This began in September. Our PCC said that as there were no plans for pastoral reorganisation suspension of presentation should not be extended. We were then told that a priest with another diocesan role *could* be a reason for suspension of presentation.

The PCC reasoned that because it *could* be a reason, it did not necessarily follow that presentation should be suspended. It was also argued that a diocesan role should not result in a priest being treated any differently to a priest with two or more parishes to minister to.

Our points were made clearly to the Archdeacon of Halifax and then a small group of the PCC made a presentation to the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee. This presentation clearly detailed the high level of activity in the parish and the varied nature of what goes on.

However the Mission and Pastoral Committee recommended to the Bishop of Wakefield that suspension of presentation should be extended.

On practical terms, this will make very little difference on a day to day basis. But that does not make it the right decision!
