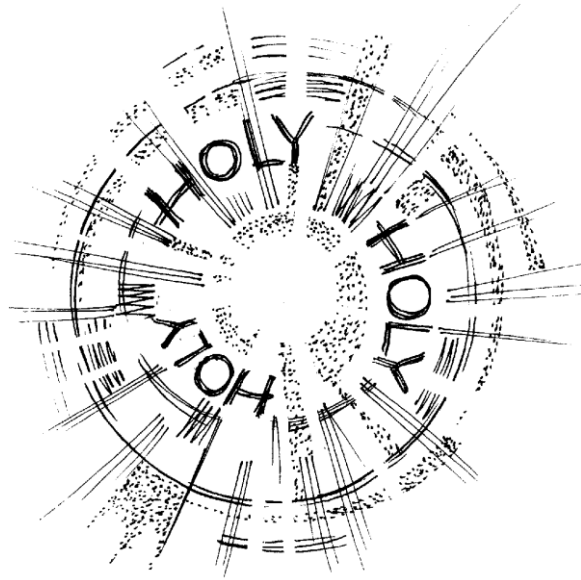

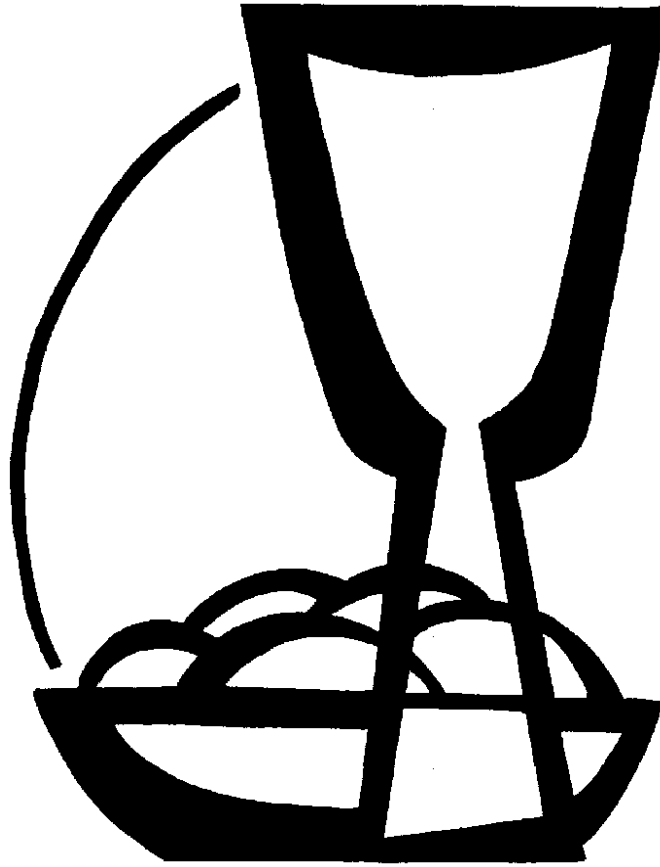

Last Sunday was a memorable day with the baptism of Malachi and Thomas and a splendid lunch. Thanks to all those who worked so hard to make things possible.

## ***Christian Aid***

So far, we have collected £464.47 from the sponsored walk and £98.71 from the collection in church. There is still money to come in from the walk! Earlier in the year we sent a sum of £615.17 for the Haiti Appeal.. This makes a total of £1178.35 most of which is Gift Aided and this will bring in a further sum of about £250. These are encouraging figures, but we need always to remember the huge task that still remains to provide for just the basic needs of the poorest in our world.

## ***Other financial matters***

It is good to report that the PCC has paid £8,200 of parish share. This compares very favourably with last year when we were only able to pay £9,000 in the whole year. We have also paid the whole insurance premium on the church compared with just 50% at this time last year.

## ***Legacies***

The PCC has recently received legacies from the estates of Billy Bray and Ruby Coull. We remember Billy and Ruby with thanks for their lives and for their generosity.

## ***Attendance statistics***

At this time of year we usually take a snapshot of our attendance figures from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost. Last year we were able to report that numbers were up by just over 5% and it is good to be able to report this year that numbers have risen by 4%.

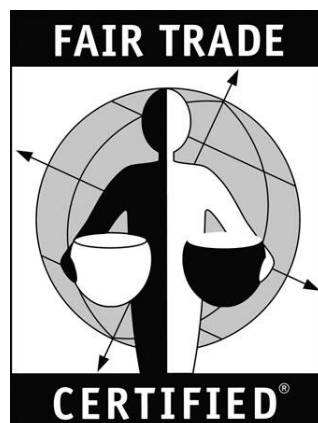
## ***The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary***

## ***Corpus Christi***

As with Ascension day, Corpus Christi is now kept on the Sunday, rather than the Thursday, after Trinity Sunday. For some, moving the day from a Thursday distances the celebration from the day on which the Eucharist was instituted. However it means that others will join the festivities who may not have come to church on the Thursday evening.

After Mass there will be the usual Procession of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction.

***The parish hall*** has been closed to allow essential maintenance work to take place. All groups will be accommodated in the narthex until the hall is available again.

Quotes are being sought for the work and when this process is complete we will be looking at ways of funding the necessary work.

## ***Advance notice***

The parish pilgrimage to Walsingham will leave on Friday 11 June, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, after Mass at 1.30pm. There will also be the usual Mass at 6.30pm. This should give everyone plenty of opportunity to come to Mass to keep this great festival.
